





Each Self-help group has total amount Rs 2,35,000 in their core fund (Rs 35000 thousand collected from their monthly saving + Rs 200,000 supported from the project).

10 Groups (8 Self Help Groups and 2 Survivors group) are registered in government offices. This year two groups have applied to get government subsidies. One group (Sursing group) has applied for group potato farming amounting Rs 500000/- and another group (Bikashmukhi group) has applied for poultry firm amounting Rs 300000/-

Beneficiaries are connected with Line agencies, they are supporting in business registration, insurance and they are facilitating them about the provision to receive government subsidies etc.

#### Impact-----

The Chairman of ward no 3 Helambu, **Mr. Dipak Khadak** said, "I have observed CHFN and its work very closely. CHFN's staffs have come to ward office and coordinated and collaborated with us. I have participated in many events and trainings that was conducted for the SHGs and community. They are closely connected with groups and communities at grass toot level, but other NGOs are like tourist in my ward. I have visited SHGs, I saw that the group members have been doing family business with the seed money supported by CHFN. Some of them are keeping goats, some are doing tunnel vegetable farming, some are doing chicken Farming, and some are keeping buffaloes etc, that has resulted to increase income of the families and reduce family violence in the community.

Now people are migrating for foreign employment with the training having better information. So, I am thankful to CHFN and appreciate the works they have done in Helambu.



### "I am able to stand on my own feet"



My name is Putli Sunar. Now I am 57 years old. It has been 9 years since my husband died. 2 daughters are married and have gone to their respective homes. I didn't have any business before. My husband used to earn little money, from that, the family was run and the education of son and daughter was also hardly managed. My husband used to drink a lot and used to beat me all the time. Once he poured acid on my leg, but it didn't have to amputate my leg and even now the wound is still there. After the death of my husband, life became harder, it was difficult to even see a couple of money. I used to earn little money by working as a daily wage earner in someone else's farm to run the house.

When CHFN started working in the community, I was recommended by the ward, I felt like I found a precious stone when I was looking for just a stone. When I joined the Janajagaran Self Help Group, I invested Rs.3000/ and added Rs.20000/ and bought a buffalo of Rs. 23000/ and now it can be sold for around Rs. 45000. After paying off all the previous loans, now I have taken another loan of Rs.20000/ and bought 2 piglets. Now these piglets have grown up and I can sell it around Rs 40000/-. I have been trained on gender-based violence, goat rearing, savings and credit trainings etc from CHFN. Additionally, CHFN have taught me something that I have not learned in life before. The fact that I was suffered greatly as my husband put acid on my leg. Let's not talk about the number of beatings and insults, I had. Now I am encouraging others If a person is subjected to violence, I go to his home and support him/her to solve it. Now I have been able to stand on my own feet. I also want to encourage many other single women like me, to start a family business and you will be able to stand in your own feet soon.

#### "Hard work paid off."

Kaili Tamang, a 66-year-old beneficiary of the BSF Chhampi in Lalitpur, turned adversity into overcome through dedication. Initially provided with three buffalos for income generation, a tragic food poisoning incident threatened her family's livelihood. With insurance as their lifeline, Kaili faced a challenging claims process but persevered, eventually receiving 90% of the insurance amount. Overflowing with gratitude, she wisely reinvests for another buffalo and sum for her family's future, expressing deep appreciation for the CHFN family's warmth, kindness, and generosity.

PROTECTION AND ADVOCACY

## Impact----

LCCHT/WCCHT policy developed and is being implemented in Helambu ward no 3 and 7.

Police In charge, Mr Manoj Shrestha said, I appreciate the initiative taken by CHFN for SGBV and HT awareness program, made good coordination and collaboration with all line agencies and likeminded organizations. Because of CHFN together we have reached to the community for SGBV and HT and child protection awareness programs. If this kinds of awareness is made intensive in every community, SGBV and HT related violence issues can be reduced soon."

More than 20 SGBV and HT cases were addressed/handled by collaboration with local government, police office and likeminded organization.

A blood related case was handled in helambu -7. Initially mother and child were kept in Melamch safe house, after few months later they are sent in safehouse in Kathmandu (Balmandir)

1941 people are reached through SGBV and HT and child protection awareness programs in Sindhupalchok and Lalitpur.

# Impact-----

Ward Chairperson of ward no 7 Mr. Nil Bahadur Khadka Said, "Through the CHFN SGBV and HT awareness program have increased community awareness and SGBV and HT cases has been reduced in the community. and sticker distribution have been very helpful to the families. After sticker distribution, My phone is very busy as everyone is directly reaching to me through my cell phone number for any services they need. Additionally, the SGBV, HT and risk behavior related programs conducted at Schools through child clubs has contributed to increase safe environment at Schools and reduced violence against Children. Through the CHFN's project events & training, I have been incapacitated. My perception on Gender has been changed and I am supporting my wife at household Chores. Through the collaboration with CHFN, my connection with communities and groups is increased more than before."



## "Buddha realized the equality of boys and daughters".

My name is Buddha Tamang, now 38 years old. My family consists of father, my wife and 3 daughters, a total of 6 members. We live in ward no 3 of Helambu, palchok.

I used to work outside the home. I did not help my spouse in household chores. There was an understanding that all these are women's work and we men are meant to go out and earn money. Since I was the only son in my family, it was believed that I should get a son even if my wife and father had the same wish and I also thought that I should get a son no matter what. Because of that, my wife and I used to fight at home. I used to sit outside till evening with my friends and come home happily.

When Compassionate Hands for Nepal started the family strengthening to combat sexual and genderbased violence project in our community, my name was also recommended by the ward office to be a selfhelp group member. In my opinion, I thought that it would be like other organizations and all the other members made me the chairman of the group. When I participated in various events and trainings organized by this organization, I got trained on gender-based violence, gender discrimination, women's safety, children's safety, human trafficking etc. Compassionate Hands for Nepal has really opened my eyes. I felt that my previous behavior towards my wife was wrong but after the training I am changed and helping my spouse in household chores. I have three daughters only; we understood that both sons and daughters are equal. My youngest daughter is just two months old. My wife once checked in the hospital and thought to have an abortion if it is a girl, but I did not agree. I said to my wife that the son and daughter both are equal, whether it is a son or a daughter then she got convinced. It was also agreed between us that this will be our last child, so we did not even go to the hospital. After nine months, we got a daughter and we are happy about that. If Compassionate hands for Nepal had not come to our community, I would not have seen my youngest daughter today and "how many daughters would we have killed in the hope of a son". Because of Compassionate Hands for Nepal, my thinking and behavior have been changed and being as a leader, I have been a witness of gender equality in the community.

## **EDUCATION**



CHFN has reached 645 children through educational supports in Lalitpur through SOL, BSF a SEED projects. Now children are being raised at homes with their families and receiving education at Schools.

Principal of Janoday Basic School Mr. Kamal Khatiwada stated that, before the SOL Tuition sessions, almost 90% of students never completed their homework but now all the project supported students are coming in the class with completing their homework."

45 Children have continued their School education through educational support.

After the SOL Tuition sessions, some students have secured first position in their final exam.

Response of Parent teachers' meeting, "During the meeting in Lele community, the parents and teachers have said that children have been disciplined, improved their hygiene, been active in learning than before, improved their School education."

Akriti Nagarkoti is a 12-year-old girl who studies in class 7 and is one of the children who has been attending SOL classes regularly. She lives in Lele, Lalitpur with her parents and younger sister. Before joining the SOL classes, she used to be an average student with average grades and her enthusiasm for her studies was also not very high. But since joining the SOL classes, she has had a huge change in her life. The SOL teachers saw a huge potential in her while helping her with her homework and curriculum and then she was encouraged by the teachers as well as her fellow classmates. She was never encouraged to perform better before by anyone, so this encouragement drove her to do well in her studies. As of now, she stood first in her class obtaining the highest marks in her classes and this has made her teachers and parents very proud of her.





Her father said, "I never knew that my daughter was capable of being the first student in the class. Thanks to the School of Life tuition class for encouraging her to give her best in her studies. It's all because of them that today my daughter obtained the first position in her class."







#### "Triumph Over Adversity"

Growing up in the impoverished village of Chhampi, Nepal, Sujata Tamang confronted a series of formidable challenges early in life. The sudden and tragic loss of her father in an accident left Sujata and her brother under the care of their young, widowed mother. 

# **BASIC HEALTH**

639 children been reached through basic health services. 285 children are reached through health and hygiene, awareness, hygienic diets, hygiene kits and eye check up. Now Children have improved their hygiene and sanitation.

# Impact

Through eye check up program, children eye diseases were diagnosed, 51 eyeglasses and 46 eye medicines were provided to the recommended children in Lalitpur.

Through the whole body check up program, most women were diagnosed with uterus problem and recommended women received medicine from the project for few days. But many of them had to take medicines for long time to be fully recovered. Now they have been more conscious about their health and are using regular medicine by themselves.

Gender Focal teacher of Ishing Basic School Mrs. Sukmaya Ghale said, "after the collaboration with CHFN, our child club is disciplined, their personal hygiene/cleanliness is improved, and they have started cleaning the surrounding environment of School."

#### Impact of Eye check-up program

Jyoti was having a problem with her eyes, from a certain distance she was unable to see things clearly. She was very worried about this problem and asked her father to visit the doctor. So as any loving father would, her father took her to the hospital and got her eyes checked and found out that she was in need of glasses. So when they were about to order the glasses the father realized that it was too expensive to purchase the glasses. So, they left the hospital with the check-up and diagnosis but without the glasses.

In March, when she heard that an "Eye Camp" was being held for SOL students, she didn't want to go to the eye camp as she knew her problem and didn't want to embarrass herself but she went there nevertheless. After the diagnosis, she was told by the CHFN staff that there was a provision for glasses, she was more than happy and almost teared up. Jyoti said, "I am very grateful to CHFN and the SOL teachers for providing this project in our community. This past year has truly been an amazing year as I got the chance to do well in my studies, and food every day and also got to visit new places. And despite all that I am really excited that I am also getting glasses for my eyes. SOL had already provided me so much and still till the very end of the year I am being helped."





# Staffs Capacity Development

- Project staffs have participated in various meetings with stakeholders and likeminded organizations forums. Now they have broadened their knowledge on development and enhanced their technical capacity as well.
- Project Coordinator Mr. Amos Thatal has participated in a day DRR workshop
- Project Assistant Mr. Bibek Yonjan is trained on story writing
- Organizations' 12 Staffs received life saving first aid training
- 5 SOL Teachers have received pre-primary teacher's training from ECEC.

#### Learnings

- Close coordination with Line agencies and key stakeholders have made them more responsible for the group sustainability and monitoring their businesses.
- Project learning and gap analysis would have been organized during and after project completion.
- New project initiation should be started in advance before project completion (at least 6 month earlier)
- At least 6 months follow up plan of each project should be developed in new proposal for group regular monitoring and coaching support after project phaseout.
- Livelihood and community Development related projects should be designed minimum for 3 years and implement it accordingly.

# Challenges

- The needs of the community are many and their expectation from the project is very high that has been challenge for project staffs, because the project budget is limited for specific objective.
- Elected local government authorities intend to fulfill their interest from the project and try to use project services in the community for their vote bank.
- Project objective is to support Local government development priorities and plans. The government authorities supposed to play supportive and advisory role, but they treat project as objects (try to make full control).
